To learn to play the mbira you need a good instrument, regular support, accessible teaching resources and lots of time.



## C MAJOR WESTERN SCALE MBIRAS

The first instruments imported for MBIRA Soc. members have been made by **Jona Wazara**, born in the Mhondoro area, where mbiras have been played for centuries. We now have some other beautiful instruments from **Leonard Chiyanike**, a real master maker. The keys are hammered hundreds of times so they become thin and wide, giving a rich note and overtone. They are soft to the touch and quite easy to play. In addition, the instruments have been tuned so that they are compatible with our western instruments such as piano, guitar, ukulele and marimba. We also learn mbira songs as singing is a vital component of mbira music
